Professional, political and communicational aspects of the development of bicycle friendly Dutch cities

A professional forum is organized on urban cycling by **Hungarian Cyclists' Club** and the **Dutch Embassy**. Four Dutch experts (**Marjolein de Lange**, independent consultant on bicycling and road safety – Dutch Cycling Embassy, **Herbert Tiemens** – Council of Governments Utrecht, **Marc van Woudenberg** – Amsterdamize, mobility consultancy services, **Mark Wagenbuur** – video maker and writer for his blog to make Dutch cycling more visible) are to participate and hold presentations, all focusing on the "mind shift" that took place in the Netherlands in the 1970s, when priority was given to cyclists and pedestrians in traffic planning and urban development projects. The moderator is **Richárd Ongjerth**, managing director at Hungarian Society for Urban Planning.
