Refunc at PLACCC Festival

Hosted at PLACCC, the festival of site-specific art, Dutch organization Refunc is to present garbage architecture (up-cycling design) via workshops and public space installations. Refunc is a laboratory for economical lifecycle extension and creates experimental structures based on waste material streams Refunc is providing a second life for found or thrown-away objects. They operate on the borders of architecture, art and design and create new products from old materials. Origin of designs are found in the object itself, by listening to its own composition, history, or local and social context. They need a problem to play with, creative improvisation with locally available waste materials lead the way to the often unpredictable results. Refunc will create a mobile installation in Budapest together with the innovative architect Gergő Kukucska and designer Juli Laczkó.



Sweelinck's organ works

Jan Pieterszoon Sweelinck (1562 - 1621) was a Dutch composer, organist, and pedagogue whose work straddled the end of the Renaissance and beginning of the Baroque eras. He was among the first major keyboard composers of Europe, and his work as a teacher helped establish the north German organ tradition. Renowned Hungarian musicians trained in the Netherlands (Gyula Szilágyi, Gábor Soós, Ágnes Várallyai) have decided to organise a concert tour with Vox Antiqua choir and dedicate it to the composer on the occasion of the 450th anniversary of his birth.



Ineke Hans's lecture

World-class Dutch designer Ineke Hans graduated at the Royal College of Art in London in 1995 and set up her design studio INEKEHANS/ARNHEM in Holland in 1998. Initially presenting and producing her own collections, the focus has moved to industrial design and commissions since 2005. The studio works on a wide range of 3d projects: furniture, products and jewelry come as one-offs, small batch products, and mass-produced items. Next to that, they work on exhibitions and some architectural projects. Ineke's lecture is organized in partnership with Budapest Design Week 2012.
